



ANNUAL SUMMARY

DISTRICT OPERATIONS



Submitted the final report for the completed South Fork Little Medicine Bow Riparian Project.

Attended the Wyoming Water Development committee meeting and received 2 approvals for Small Waters Project applications.

The District purchased 12.25 acres of land in Laramie in July 2022. Plans for a new office building are being budgeted.

LRCD Staff completed Water Quality recertification training through WACD, and attended WYRED and the Nebraska Ranch Practicum for additional training opportunities.

PROGRAMS & RESOURCES



Allocated \$67,500 in cost share programs, funding a total of 11 natural resource projects within Albany County.

Reviewed and commented on 11 county notices.

LRCD staff farmed and planted 6 Living Snow Fences (LSF), totaling 300 trees and shrubs planted in Albany County.

Sold 3,265 trees and shrubs to local community members at our annual Tree Sale.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE



Provided 19 custom seed mix recommendations.

Conducted 17 Living Snow Fence site visits.

Conducted 20 rural site visits for potential resource concerns and future projects within Albany County.

Assisted NRCS with range monitoring for 2 private landowners.

OUTREACH & EDUCATION



Presented Stream Trailer demonstrations to 438 Albany County elementary students at 4 separate events.

Hosted an informational booth at the My Wild Lands Film Festival with over 200 public attendees.

Partnered with UW Extension for a Tree Care & Maintenance Workshop with 62 registered participants.
